Thin Mane and Tail? – advice from Jessica Jahiel, www.horse-sense.org

Don't comb or curry your horse's mane or tail -- ever. Even when you wash and condition them, separate the hairs gently with your fingers, or use a soft brush when the conditioned hair is dry. Every time you use a comb or curry, you pull and break hairs -- over the course of a few months, this can make a big difference to the horse's mane and tail.

You won't be able to feed your horse so that he'll grow hair that he isn't genetically programmed to grow, but I've seen some amazing results when horses with thin manes and tails have been given a good-quality biotin supplement. Talk to your veterinarian before you add ANY supplement to your horse's diet -- in fact, talk to him anyway, because you need to find out whether your horse's diet is balanced and whether he needs a vitamin and mineral supplement formulated for your particular area. If he needs one, your vet will be able to tell you, and can probably tell you exactly which one he recommends.

You can also ask about biotin supplements -- although most veterinarians, unless they've had personal experience with such supplements, will tend to put them in the "can't-hurt-might-help" category.

If you decide to try this, you'll want to find a supplement that provides at least 15 mg of biotin in each daily dose, and that offers methionine and zinc along with the biotin. The horse that showed the most improvement was being fed biotin to improve his shelly hooves. Over the course of a year, his hooves got much better, which is what his owner had wanted -- and his mane and tail got much longer and thicker than they had ever been before.

Bandaging Awkward Areas

Wounds are often in places where it is difficult to keep a bandage on.

Forearm

The forearm is a common place for injury but very difficult to keep a bandage in place. Start by dressing and bandaging in the same way as for the lower limb but do not go below the top of the knee with the bandage. Make sure that the bandage is even all the way down.

The biggest problem with bandaging in this area is preventing it from slipping down. A strip of sticking plaster may be required around the upper part of the bandage to prevent it slipping, but make sure that the plaster is no tighter than the bandage itself.

Knees and Hocks

Use a figure of eight technique. Put plenty of padding around the joint, and bandage in place using a slightly elasticated or self-adhesive bandage. When this is done correctly, a knee bandage forms a cross at the front of the knee leaving the back of the knee not covered by the bandage, allowing the joint to bend.

To bandage the hock do the reverse so that the point of the hock has the cross over it and the front is left uncovered.

Use of Tubular Bandages

Tubular bandages provide an excellent alternative for securing a dressing in areas such as a knee or hock. They are pulled on like a stocking and can simply be folded up whilst changing the dressing and cleaning the wound, and then folded down again once

a clean dressing is in place. To enable movement of the joints a gap can be cut out over prominent bones. To prevent the bandage slipping once in place, tape around the top.

To make it easier to slip the tubular bandage over the horse's hoof put a plastic carrier bag over the hoof and pull the bandage over the top of the bag.
